


## HALF TERMLY NEWSLETTER
















#### YEAR ONE

The children have continued to work brilliantly in maths, reading and writing. Using what they have been taught in class and putting in to practise has really been wonderful to see. This shows how much the children really are maturing and becoming such sensible and hard working pupils.

During our afternoon curriculum, the children have enjoyed producing some beautiful one point perspective pieces of art work. In DT, some super tasty healthy toasties were designed, made and evaluated. The children's knowledge and skills in Geography have been amazing during our Europe topic which they have really enjoyed taking part in. Internet research was the focus in our computing sessions which the children really engaged with and were so quick to pick up the skills being taught! Sound was the topic in science this half term and the children enjoyed working scientifically in pairs making their own string telephones to test if distance effects volume. In Writing, we have been learning how to plan and write a balanced argument, considering the use of screen time and how beneficial/harmful this can be. Ask your children what they found out - we learned some very interesting facts. In DT, we even made our very own pizzas!

#### YEAR SIX

This term has been a busy one for our Year 6 children! We have enjoyed being creative in our DT lessons by making our very own phone cases using different materials and stitching techniques. The children have produced some amazing work and picked up some new skills in the process! The children have also worked incredibly hard to produce their final piece for their Romero Britto style art project. They carried out research to find popular local landmarks such as the Riverside Stadium and the Transporter Bridge and used these as inspiration for their work. It's clear to see that we have some artists for the future here at Grangetown.

We have enjoyed going on trips this term. To support with our DT project, our children visited Outwood Normanby and made use of their Computer Aided Design equipment. The children were able to design and create their very own keyring using computers, laser cutters and 3D printers! Some of our Year 6's have continued to impress at sporting events including athletics and football. We are very proud of our children for their constant hard work and dedication.

Finally, we said goodbye and thank you to Miss York from Tees Valley Music Service who held her final ukulele sessions with Year 6. The progress the children have made in their music throughout these sessions is exceptional – some of our children have already started to bring in ukuleles of their own!
















In writing, we created our own virtual bonfire night and enjoyed watching the fireworks in the ARC. From this, we worked on creating non-fiction information texts for a safety poster on Bonfire Night for

Cleveland Fire Brigade to tell people how to stay safe. We also went on a wintery walk and used our 5 senses to write a calligram poem about what we could see, hear, feel, smell and taste. We warmed up in the classroom with a hot chocolate afterwards! In maths,

we have been working hard on developing our multiplication and division skills and recall of times tables facts. We have been doing daily occupational therapy together as a whole class in the hall and we enjoyed sensory breaks throughout the day. In PSHE,







we have been doing lots of work on anti-bullying and what makes a kind friend. We have enjoyed working with Tees Valley Wildlife Trust as part of our 5 things to do to make a home for wildlife and help a wild animal. We built birdboxes and put these up in the local Millennium Green and went on a litter pick with the volunteers at Tees Valley Wildlife and Rita from Cleveland Fire Brigade.
