EYFS KIDDIWINKLES, NURSERY & RECEPTION

In Art, the children in Reception have explored the artists Vincent Van Gogh, Jackson Pollock and Kandinsky. They have investigated with a range of materials freely to develop their own version of 'The Starry night.' They also listened to music whilst painting, inspired by the artist Kandinsky. We had a fantastic trip to Redcar Leisure Centre to take part in the balance festival. As well as the bus journey being extremely exciting, we had lots of fun riding the balance bikes and learned some new skills. We were very proud of how 'Ready, Respectful and Safe' all the children were. Forest School this half term has been a cold one but has given us the opportunity to discuss the winter weather and how we need to wrap up warm. We have also been looking after our birds in winter by making them bird feeders and a huge nest!

We went on a trip to Eston Sports Centre where we took part in lots of sports activities. For example, we raced using balance boards, balanced bean bags on tennis rackets, played catch the bean bag using PE cones.

We had 'Storytime with Anne' which was fantastic. We listened to a story called 'Oi Frog!' and Anne made it so funny. It was brilliant!

We have spent lots of times in our outdoor learning area - playing with the water, sand and messy stuff. We are really excited about the new outdoor space and can't wait to see how this develops.

YEAR THREE

In Year 3 this term we have moved on to our new topic in DT food, which has involved discussions about what is healthy or not and what makes up a balanced diet. This has involved lots of different practical lessons trying different breads and discussing what the children prefer.


